A leaking water heater should never be ignored. Sometimes, it's a minor issue, but it can often lead to a broken water heater and a huge mess. No matter what, be sure to find the source of the leak and get it fixed as soon as possible.

## REASONS A WATER HEATER MAY LEAK

Standard water heaters hold dozens of gallons of water, ready to be used when any hot water faucet is turned on. There are ample opportunities for these containers to leak. A few reasons you may experience a leaking water heater include:

- A broken or clogged water intake or output line: Water has to be able to enter and exit a water heater. If the input or output pipes are clogged, dripping at the connection points may occur.
- A malfunctioning pressure relief valve: Water heaters are under a lot of pressure due to the changing temperature of the water inside
  the tank. A pressure relief valve may let out some pressure and water to ensure the safety of the tank.
- A degrading water heater container floor: Water heaters can collect debris and chemicals at the bottom of the tank for years. These chemicals can degrade the metal floor of the tank, leading to significant damage and loss of water.
- An open water heater drain valve: Water heaters feature a drainage valve for situations when the entire tank must be emptied. If this valve is open even slightly, water will pour out.

In some of these situations, a simple turn of a knob can solve the issue. In other instances, it's vital that you call a plumber before the problem gets worse.

## MAJOR ISSUES FOR LEAKING WATER HEATERS
